### New 2017 Centennial Code Compliance

**Proper Storage of Refuse Containers -** Homeowners are required to remove garbage cans from public streets within 24 hours of placement. Garbage cans must be stored in areas not visible from the street, and lids must be used to minimize odors and keep pests away.

**Junk or inoperable vehicles -** May not be parked or stored on private property visible from any public or private property. Please note any junk or inoperable vehicles located on a public street are addressed by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office at 303.795.4711.

**Unlawful Growth of Grass and Weeds -** Grass and weeds may not exceed 8 inches in height on a property or any adjoining planting strips and alleyways.

Failure to take action will result in a graduated notification process that may result in a court summons and fines in the amount of up to \$2,650 per day, per violation. To report a violation, please call the City of Centennial at (303) 325-8000.

There are two large plants that stand out where the porch and sidewalk meet. The orange pyracantha, or firethorn shrub, is quite eye catching with clumps of orange berries. Opposite the orange is a shock of magenta. The agastache plant, or double bubble mint, has dark green foliage with rigid stalks of striking pinky purple spiky flowers. A third plant is the whirling butterfly, or gaura, with loose sprays of white flowers tinged with pink. With a breeze it looks like small butterflies. To complement those three plants is the silver heels horehound, almost like the lamb's ear, green with frilly edging. There's also basket of gold, some lilies, mums, ice plant groundcover.
