Hello Heritage Place Homeowner,

Heritage elementary school just completed the fall session of Parent / Teacher Conferences. These conferences occur when the school year is one-third completed. Your neighborhood students are off to an outstanding start! As a school, we have shifted our instructional focus from writing and math to reading and math. The reason for this is that writing has been our focus for the past four years. In this time, teachers



have refined their craft and students are writing at high levels. Writing at high levels means that students "think" like authors. Authors recall experiences, share understandings about scientific processes and respond to literature. While making sure grammar and conventions are correct, being an author entails much more. Authors write to connect with their reader. They consider a variety of organizational structures and choose the one that will have the greatest impact on the reader. Authors additionally think through their choice of words, use of metaphors and analogies. They select the organizational structure and elaborate on their ideas so as to have the greatest impact on their reader as possible. Through it all, students share their human experience and communicate life messages based on their lived experience and understanding of the world. As we shift to focusing on reading, our overarching goal is for students to be advanced readers and mathematicians.



Locations include South Suburban's Willow Spring Service Center, 7100 S. Holly St., in Centennial and Cornerstone Park, 5150 S. Windermere St. (corner of W. Belleview Ave. and S. Windermere St.)

Residents within the South Suburban Park and Recreation District can drop off their tree seven days a week from sunrise to sunset in Cornerstone's parking lot, adjacent to the soccer fields, or at the Willow Spring Service Center in the designated enclosure by the front gate.

Your Cherry Park Home Value Update From Your Neighborhood Realtor

Home prices continued their winning ways and pushed higher in October due in part to a strengthening economy, an acute lack of home supply and low home loan rates. Data analytics firm CoreLogic reported that home prices, including distressed sales, surged 7 percent from October 2016 to October 2017 and were up 0.9 percent from September to October. Looking ahead, CoreLogic sees a slowing in prices. Expectations are for a rise of



4.2 percent from October 2017 to October 2018. Here is a chart which shows our neighborhood appreciation over the last five years by median sales price.
